For youths in the North (March 16-19): Youths in the northern part of Peninsular Malaysia can look forward to the regional camp in Kedah!

Fun for children: The SU Primary Age (SUPA; May 30-June 2) camp has funfilled teaching and activities especially for children aged 8-12, to explore the riches of God's word and learn about Jesus. In the midst of all this, they get to enjoy God's beautiful creation too! Hear what Isaac Koay, aged 11, has to say about last year's camp,

- Continue to build on the NSCFL and Word Alive camps and look to develop more evangelistic camps.
- 5. A big push to be given to the Bible Engagement ministry in 2015.
- 6. With the SU/FES Campsite completed, to look at how to maximise its potential and usage.
- 7. Actively look for new staff in all our ministry departments, especially bi-lingual personnel.

Some consider the outlook for 2015 to be bleak on many fronts, but we can look to the Lord to provide and bring fruit out of these efforts when they are done for His Kingdom.

We are pleased to let you know that we have added all the above facilities without increasing our building footprint. All the green, grassy areas, fruit trees and stream are still there. You can still pitch and stay in tents to accommodate 88pax if you wish.

We are thankful to all who have worked hard and contributed to making our SU/FES campsite a much better place. Most of all, we are thankful to God for His provision, protection and ensuring a smooth redevelopment of the campsite.
