Here are what our interns have to share about their internship experiences with us.



Grace Wong (Intern, Central Region, 19 Years Old)

Coming into SU, I was exposed to schools and churches, meeting children and teens from all kinds of backgrounds. I'm not good at handling young people, but I'm grateful for the opportunity to be trained and to grow. It's not surprising to find yourself on a lunch table discussing matters of theology and the Scriptures. While this allowed me to see matters of the faith from different perspectives, ultimately everyone is united in the same Gospel. If you're considering an internship with SU, give your time in service to the Lord, and your labour will not be in vain.

Felix Wong (Intern, Central and Northern Region, 18 Years Old)

During my internship, I visited many Christian Fellowships (CFs) and chapels in schools. That meant that I had to meet, get to know, and work together with many different types of people. To me as an introvert, it was a rather scary experience. Growing up in the pandemic made me a little scared to talk to people and I had almost zero skills in engaging with unfamiliar people. Thankfully, I was provided with countless opportunities to engage with people of different backgrounds and experiences. I am very thankful for this opportunity to be able to work with Scripture Union.



Aisen Oh (Intern, Central Region, 22 Years Old)

One of my small goals during internship was to preach the Gospel in Malaysia's 3 main languages - BM, Chinese, and English, which I managed to do by God's grace. At SU, the Gospel is preached to young people with the relevant contexts and language. I'm constantly amazed at God's providence in sustaining the various regional teams in their ministries. Would I recommend this internship? Yes, whole-heartedly. This internship programme has pushed me to read and understand the Bible properly, with teaching the Scriptures and sharing Jesus in mind. In that process, I've grown to appreciate God and His Word in many ways.

Ricky Raui (Intern, Sabah Region, 21 Years Old)

I met and served many students and fellow Christians through SU camps and I got better at understanding and dealing with people. Regular training equipped interns like me with essential knowledge to effectively help out at camps and grow personally and spiritually. I received very helpful guidance from my fellow colleagues that made me value the importance of teamwork and mutual encouragement. Through the sharing of speakers and mentors and camp activities, I learned that it is not enough to just serve in ministry but the ultimate goal is to draw closer to God and build a relationship with Him.

Velly Skyla (Intern, Sabah Region, 18 Years Old)

Serving as an intern with encouraging and godly colleagues helped me to improve my knowledge and skills in communicating with various individuals, sharing God's Word according to different needs, making and implementing plans, and depending on God in carrying out tasks. At my current age of 18, I'm very interested in ministry with teenagers as I'm able to relate to their struggles as I share with them how God has shaped me through my past teenage experiences. I received training for skills needed in ministry such as computer skills, evangelism, and planning Bible sessions for camps.



Sabah Region



Kolokium Bible Knowledge dan Persatuan Pelajar Kristian

Segala pujian dan syukur kepada Tuhan, kolokium anjuran SiEC yang dijalankan pada 29 Julai 2023 yang lalu bertemakan "Mari Kuasai Tanah Ini!" (Yosua 1:3) telah dihadiri seramai 146 orang yang terdiri daripada guru-guru Kristian di seluruh Sabah termasuklah Pengetua, Guru Besar dan juga pemimpin gereja. Kami berkesempatan memperkenalkan pelayanan Scripture Union dan bahan-bahan pelajaran rohani penginjilan dan pemuridan kepada guru-guru.

Kem Berjalin Dengan Firman

Pada 7-9 Julai 2023, kami berkesempatan menjayakan "Kem Berjalin dengan Firman" bersama-sama dengan 64 pelajar Kristian di Dream Hostel, Tenom.

Melalui kem ini, peserta dapat menyedari kepentingan berjalin dan belajar Firman Tuhan yang dapat membina dan memperkuatkan hubungan mereka secara peribadi dengan Tuhan dan mengerti tentang cerita penting Tuhan dan kehendak-Nya. Pelajar diajari langkah mudah untuk membaca dan menyelidiki Firman Tuhan menggunakan kaedah 5B, iaitu Berdoa, Baca, Berfikir, Bertindak dan Berdoa. Kaedah 5B ini dapat membantu pelajar melihat perwatakan dan sifat Tuhan dengan lebih terperinci

Objektif kolokium ini adalah untuk berkongsi isu utama, cabaran dan peluang untuk pembentukan watak dan kerohanian dalam sistem persekolahan. Selain itu, terdapat perkongsian mengenai kisah kejayaan Persatuan Pelajar Kristian (PPK) dan Bible Knowledge dibeberapa buah sekolah di Sabah.

Melalui kolokium ini kami berharap guru-guru Kristian di Sabah akan terus disuntikkan semangat dalam menjayakan Persatuan Pelajar Kristian dan Bible Knowledge di sekolah.

dan dapat mengalami Tuhan dalam kehidupan mereka.

Di samping itu juga, peserta dapat mendalami dan memahami bahawa Yesuslah yang Teragung dan Pertama! (Dia Penyelamat Manusia) dan diperkukuhkan lagi dengan keperluan untuk hidup tekun dalam Tuhan. Melihat ketekunan, keseronokan dan hati yang mahu belajar Firman Tuhan daripada pelajar ini, memberi suntikan semangat kepada kami. Doa kami agar para pelajar akan terus bertumbuh dalam mengenali Tuhan dengan lebih mendalam lagi dan terus berseronok meneliti Firman Tuhan menggunakan kaedah 5B ini.



Pelayanan Sekolah

Pada bulan April hingga Ogos, kami sangat bersyukur kerana telah diberi peluang untuk melawat dan berkongsi Firman Tuhan dengan Persatuan Pelajar Kristian dibeberapa buah sekolah sekitar Sabah seperti Persatuan Pelajar Kristian SMK Tun Fuad yang diadakan di Gereja Katolik Mary Immaculate pada 5 Mei, 16 Jun dan 21 Julai 2023, Kaio Academy pada 17 Julai 2023, dan Persatuan Pelajar Kristian, Joy Club SK St Agnes Likas pada 4 Ogos 2023. Kami sangat bersukacita melihat respon kesungguhan, keinginan dan kerinduan para pelajar mengenal Tuhan dalam hidup mereka.

Pada 19 Ogos 2023 pula, kami berkesempatan mengadakan satu program khas di SK Stella Maris iaitu program Akhlak Terpuji yang melibatkan pelajar Kristian tahap 2 (10-12 Tahun) sekolah tersebut. 153 pelajar yang menyertai program ini telah mempelajari tentang kepercayaan kepada Yesus Kristus dan disertai beberapa aktiviti lain seperti Iman Saya, bagaimana memupuk tabiat rohani dan juga membina persahabatan yang baik. Meskipun umur mereka masih muda, namun tindakan iman mereka menerima Yesus sebagai Tuhan dan Penyelamat dalam hidup mereka memberi satu sukacita yang besar kepada kami. Kami berdoa agar benih-benih Firman Tuhan yang sudah ditaburkan kepada anak-anak ini akan bertumbuh dalam hidup mereka, terus dipimpin oleh Roh Kudus dan Tuhanlah yang akan menjaga pertumbuhan mereka sehingga dewasa.
