EQUIPPING TEACHERS TO FAITHFULLY AND CREATIVELY TEACH GOD'S WORD



Our Growing Children's Ministry Trainings

For the past two years, there has been a rising and urgent need among churches: Sunday School teachers are longing for practical, faithful, and creativity-driven training to help them teach the Bible to children effectively. In response to this growing demand, we began developing our very own Children's Ministry Training (CMT) modules, designed not only to equip teachers with biblical

knowledge, but also to inspire them with hands-on skills and creative ideas for engaging young learners.

The impact these trainings have had on participants who have attended across different regions in Malaysia and beyond has been deeply encouraging.



Why We Began: A Pressing Need in Churches

Many volunteers enter children's ministry with a heart to serve, yet feel unequipped or unsure of how to teach the Bible in a way that is both faithful and engaging. Recognising this need, our team began developing training modules to meet this need.

The first module focuses on helping teachers prepare and teach Bible lessons creatively, moving beyond traditional methods to include

interactive and hands-on learning.

The second module trains teachers to see and teach the whole Bible as God's Big Story — a unified narrative that finds its ultimate fulfillment in Christ. This has helped many teachers understand Scripture more clearly and communicate its message to children with greater confidence.

Training That Is Faithful, Creative, Practical, and Fun

Our approach to training goes beyond theory. Each session is packed with creative ideas, demonstration lessons, and practical activities that teachers can immediately bring back to their classrooms. Participants are not just passive listeners; they actively step into the shoes of the children they teach. They join in games, try out activities, and experience firsthand how fun, interactive methods can make biblical truths memorable while remaining faithful to Scripture. One participant from Klang Valley shared, “The training was really engaging... thanks for letting

me learn how we can come up with exciting games ourselves when teaching Sunday School children.”

Another from Johor Bahru said, “It was great experiencing the lesson in the shoes of a child... getting involved in games and activities while learning how to teach children the Bible.”

These testimonies reflect our heart: to refresh, inspire and re-equip teachers for long-term ministry.



Growing Attendance Across Regions

Our most recent Klang Valley CMT brought together over 100 participants from 24 churches, a joyful gathering of people united by a shared desire to teach God’s Word well. In Johor Bahru, around 60 participants from more than 10 churches in Johor Bahru and Melaka joined us for a fruitful time of learning.

We also conducted Module 1 of our Children’s Ministry Training in Melaka, graciously hosted

by Wesley Methodist Church. This training was attended by 70 participants from 12 churches and organisations, and the feedback was immensely encouraging.

Beyond external training, we also conducted an internal training for our Borneo staff team, focusing on how to engage young people creatively and faithfully through pre-recorded video talks.

Expanding Beyond Malaysia: A Blessing to Brunei

We were invited to Brunei, where we conducted CMT for both English and Chinese-speaking Sunday School teachers from 6–7 different churches. Many participants expressed how helpful it was to learn creative ways to teach the Gospel to children.

One teacher shared, “I was feeling lost and discouraged, but now I am refreshed and encouraged to continue serving.”

Thankful for What God Is Doing

We are deeply encouraged by the overwhelmingly positive feedback from all who have attended our sessions. Comments such as “I got ideas on how to incorporate engaging activities while staying true to the Word” remind us that the Lord is using these trainings to strengthen His church.

We remain committed to equipping teachers to teach the Bible creatively, effectively and faithfully, so that the next generation may know and love God’s Word.

“Flourish” - Jesus, the True Vine

For the first time in six years, Scripture Union Peninsular Malaysia successfully held an in-person Camp Legacy (28-31 Dec 2025) at Seminari Theoloji Malaysia (STM), Seremban. Formerly known as the National School Christian Fellowship Leaders (NSCFL) Camp, Camp Legacy is specially designed to equip teenage leaders serving in school CFs and churches.

While the number of participants (20 campers from Selangor, Kedah, and Malacca) was smaller compared to previous years, the impact of the camp has been deeply encouraging.

One camper shared, “Last time, when I woke up, I would look at my phone. Now when I wake up, I will start reading the Bible.”

The camp’s theme, “Flourish,” was based on John 15:5, challenging young leaders that true fruitfulness flows only from abiding in Jesus, the True Vine. The theme talks were delivered by Marianne Liaw, with plenary sessions led by Dylan Loke, Joel Mohan, and Chai Tze Kwang.

Age-specific workshops were conducted to better address the needs of the campers. Dylan Loke facilitated “The Importance of Christian Community” (ages 13–14), while Joel Mohan led “Discipling Your Juniors & Peers” (ages 15–17). Group officers and staff faithfully guided discussions, reflections, and offered personal encouragement and counsel.

Fun night saw campers dressed in school uniforms, completing various tasks while officers took on the roles of teachers, creating laughter, bonding, and lasting memories.

During the dedicated time of prayer and fasting from 9am to 4pm, campers reflected on the sessions, meditated on Scripture, and spent time with God, with officers available for counselling. Many campers shared openly about their faith journeys and how God’s Word became clearer to them during the camp.

Camp Legacy 2026 is scheduled for 7-11 December 2026, so if you’re a parent, teacher or youth ministry leader in church, please spread the word and mark the dates!



Gathering and Training Student Leaders

Scripture Union's Committee Planning Retreat (CPR) has taken many forms over the years. With its inception in 2019 to now, we have trained over 100 student leaders across multiple schools in the Klang Valley and hope to expand this ministry to other regions.

Untapped Potential Student Leaders

From our time journeying with several Christian Fellowship (CF) Committees, we have observed that there is so much untapped potential that sometimes go wasted because a committee may get stuck in focusing on simply "trying to solve issues and setbacks" rather than learning to cast a vision, utilise their strengths, and execute a plan.

Difficulty in Grooming Future Student Leaders

The other matter of concern, as we supported CFs, was that we found that CF leaders were finding it increasingly more difficult to groom and establish the next generation of leaders for their CFs. This has sadly led to various CFs being shut down or passed into the hands of weak leaders.

Harvesting the Benefits of CPR

Therefore, for the year 2026, we will gather 60 plus student leaders together in Kuala Lumpur from 11 different schools to train them and prepare them to run their respective CFs in their schools. With practical training (such as helping them to establish structure in their programmes, to spiritual lessons and helping them to understand what it means to be a leader according to the Bible) we look forward to seeing the fruits throughout

the year. Furthermore, we also see cooperation and encouragement between students from different schools. It is truly a blessing to witness students from different schools and backgrounds come together and encourage one another in this ministry that they are in. We pray and hope that this CPR can be a catapult that launches their Christian Fellowships in the direction God has in store for them.

Pray for sustained passion among student leaders, unity within CF groups, and boldness for students to be faithful witnesses of Christ in their schools. Pray also for wisdom and strength for all who serve alongside them.

May God continue to establish His Word in the hearts of young people, shaping them to love Him and serve others faithfully, for His glory alone.





“Fire and Wind”: The Holy Spirit

We give thanks and praise to God for the Interschool Christian Fellowship (ISCF) Rally held on 27 September 2025. With the theme “Fire and Wind”, taken from Acts 1:8, the rally brought together about 490 students, teachers and volunteers from schools across Penang for a powerful day of fellowship, worship, and engagement with God’s Word. We praise God for the opportunity to gather young people to be reminded of the work of the Holy Spirit and the calling to live as Christ’s witnesses.

Through two main sessions, students were challenged and encouraged to reflect on the meaning of receiving power from the Holy Spirit. The messages pointed students to God’s presence at work within them, calling them to be bold, faithful, and grounded in Christ as they live out their faith in school and beyond. Many were encouraged to see that faith is not only personal, but something that shapes how they live and relate to others.

The rally also featured 13 workshops that provided

practical spaces for students to explore how the theme of Fire and Wind connects with their daily lives. These workshops helped students think about discipleship, leadership, and faith in action. Games and shared activities added to the joy of the day, creating an atmosphere of unity and openness where students from different schools could connect and build friendships.

We thank God that many students encountered Him in personal and meaningful ways. During times of worship, prayer, and reflection, hearts were stirred, faith was renewed, and seeds were planted. We praise God for His work among the students.

As we look back on this rally, we ask you to join us in prayer that the work God has begun will continue. Pray that the fire ignited in the hearts of the campers will not stop at the rally, but will carry on into the daily lives of these students, shaping how they live, lead, and witness for Christ.

Sebelum tirai tahun 2025 dilabuhkan, Tuhan telah membuka jalan untuk berlangsungnya Kem Transform, Impact & Lead bersama pemuda-pemudi kawasan Taginambur, Kota Belud. Sepanjang kem ini, turut diberkati dengan kesungguhan para remaja yang hadir. Mereka bukan sekadar menyertai aktiviti, tetapi benar-benar memberi fokus dan hati kepada setiap pelajaran yang disampaikan.

Namun yang paling menghayat hati kami ialah saat mereka mula mengungkapkan isi hati terdalam tentang identiti mereka yang sejati dalam Kristus Yesus. Walaupun personaliti setiap seorang berbeza, kasih Yesus telah menyatukan mereka. Kasih itu memberi kekuatan untuk saling mengasihi, menerima kelemahan, dan menghargai

kelebihan diri sendiri serta orang lain.

Para remaja juga menyedari bahawa dunia ini penuh dengan cabaran. Namun mereka diingatkan bahawa identiti sebagai anak-anak Tuhan tidak akan pernah berubah. Keyakinan ini menjadi pelita yang menuntun langkah mereka, agar tidak goyah walau dimanapun mereka berada atau apa pun yang mereka lakukan.

Pelayanan Kanak-Kanak: Perayaan Natal

Menjelang Natal, kami berpeluang untuk merayakan Natal bersama-sama dengan kanak-kanak gereja Calvary Charismatic Center, Keningau. Perayaan Natal ini adalah untuk memperingati kelahiran Yesus Kristus serta menanamkan nilai iman dan sukacita kepada kanak-kanak.

Tema Natal adalah Yesus membawa sukacita bagi dunia. Aktiviti yang mengajar nilai kasih, pengampunan, dan sukacita dalam kehidupan seharian dan bahwa Yesus adalah sumber sukacita sejati. Dalam masa yang sama, kami memberikan hadiah kepada mereka sebagai lambang kasih Tuhan yang memberi tanpa syarat. Terlihat jelas sukacita yang terpancar dari wajah

kanak-kanak. Mereka bukan hanya bergembira dengan nyanyian dan hadiah, tetapi juga memahami bahawa kelahiran Yesus adalah hadiah terbesar bagi dunia.

Selain itu kami juga mendengar kanak-kanak sendiri mengatakan bahawa Natal bukan sekadar hari memberi atau menerima hadiah, tetapi tentang Yesus yang membawa damai dan sukacita. Kanak-kanak belajar bahwa sukacita sejati datang dari Yesus, bukan dari benda material.

Melalui kesederhanaan acara bersama kanak-kanak, kasih Kristus dapat dirasakan dan dihidupi.

Throughout our time in the region, we received encouraging feedback from pastors, leaders, and church members who shared how SU's ministry has been a blessing to their congregations.

As we look ahead, we pray for more opportunities to partner with churches across the Southern Region so that together we may impact more young lives with God's Word. We also ask the Lord to raise up a faithful SU staff worker who can be based in the South to serve and strengthen this growing ministry.
